

## Meet Mitch Budman, the Head of the Schuylkill's Go-To Guy

**W**HEN MITCH BUDMAN WENT GAME HUNTING for the first time, he brought down an Alaskan moose so big it was the world record at the time.

His friends and fellow rowers at University Barge Club, where the moose's head is now majestically mounted, weren't surprised. When Mitch takes aim at a problem, the problem is quickly dispatched, fortunately in more peaceful ways.

Competitors, coaches and onlookers who are enjoying this year's Head of the Schuylkill Regatta are also enjoying the fruits of almost three decades of Mitch's quiet, behind-the-scenes guidance of the event's many moving parts. When he began, HOSR was a 250ish-boat, one-day affair organized out of shoe boxes by dedicated, but all-volunteer UBC members, most of whom, including Mitch, had full-time jobs off the water. UBC rowers laid the course themselves, stuffed registration packets, and refereed the races. Starting with the finances, Mitch helped improve the various ingredients (including such romantic items as parking) that made the event safe and enjoyable. Volunteers from other clubs joined in to help.

The regatta eventually outgrew the volunteer organization structure. Mitch helped recruit professional help to deal with timing and registration. One and a half years ago, he wooed Jen Wesson, a former coach, as the year-round director to oversee what has grown to a 1,950+ boat, 8,900 competitor, now two-day event.

Perhaps he got his ability to direct the troops from his three years as a Marine or his 11 years as the COO of a food manufacturing company in South Philadelphia. In his spare time, he helped start a cigar manufacturing company in Nicaragua that exports its stogies to the U.S. under the name "Acid". He sold his share of the company and recently sold his Beechcraft 36 Bonanza. He now is traveling more with his tolerant wife of 30 years, Diane Budman.

Mitch came late to rowing. In the late 1980s, he was introduced to a UBC member who invited him to row one day at 5:30. Mitch said, "Great. I'll come over after work."

"That's 5:30 in the MORNING," said his new rowing partner. Mitch showed up and never left.

Between running regattas, he has coached teams all over the area. This past summer he recruited and trained a team of rowers from across the country whom he took

to the Maccabee games in Israel. They had to settle for 14 gold, 3 silver and 4 bronze medals, the regatta's top haul. Mitch was honored with a medal for top coach.

Mitch speaks for all involved in organizing the HOSR, "We break our backs to make sure it's, number ONE, safe and also a great experience. I'm looking for smiling faces."

Even if you don't meet Mitch in person, you'll be enjoying his presence. (Though, if it's lousy weather, that's the one thing he DOESN'T control!) And, if you have time, stop by University Barge Club, #7 Boathouse Row, and at least say "hi" to the moose!

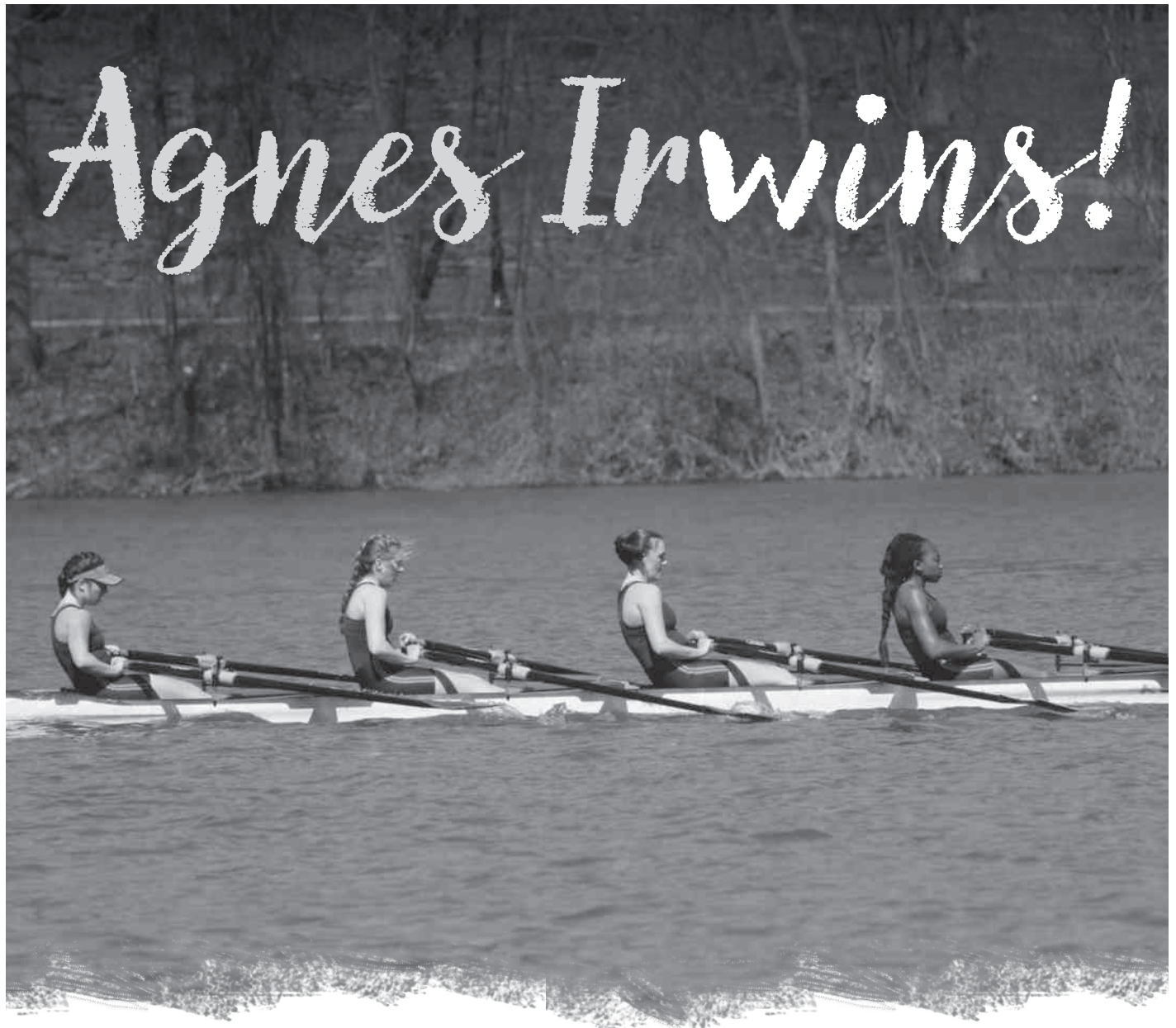

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# The Herb Lotman United States Rowing Challenge: Helping Seize the American Dream Once Again

**T**HE PHILADELPHIA GOLD CHALLENGE CUP FOUNDATION is well known for its marquee race, the Gold Cup Challenge. The Gold Cup is the most storied race in Philadelphia's rich rowing history and one of the most exciting rowing competitions outside of the Olympic Games. The top amateur single scullers compete against each other in a sprint race on the famed Schuylkill River. The Gold Cup was first awarded in 1922 to Vesper Boat Club's John B. Kelly, Sr., after he won the 1920 Olympic gold medal in the single sculls. The Cup disappeared in the early 1960s, but was recovered by a group of rowing enthusiasts led by the late businessman and philanthropist Herb Lotman. It was run in 2011 for the first time in over 50 years and will be held again in 2018.

In April of this year, the Philadelphia Gold Challenge Cup Foundation announced a partnership with USRowing, the Head of The Charles Regatta, the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta, and Regatta Central to host the inaugural Herb Lotman United States Rowing Challenge in 2017.

The Lotman Challenge is comprised of three separate open weight events starting with the USRowing Club National Championships on July 12-16 in Bethel, Ohio followed by the Head of The Charles Regatta on Oct. 21 and culminating on Oct. 28 at the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta. The races are 2,000 meters, approximately 5,000 meters, and 4,000 meters, respectively, truly identifying the best all around American male and female scullers.

The Foundation created the Lotman Challenge to further promote and develop single sculling in the United States and will award prize money to the top American men and women scullers accumulating the most points over the course of the three-race series.

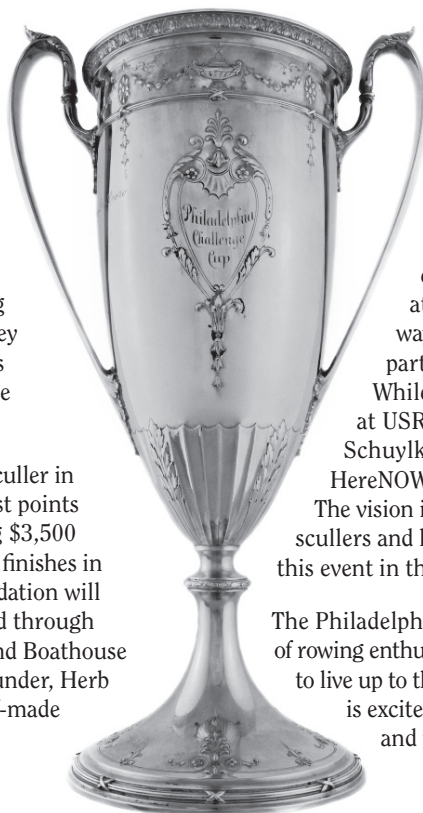
At the conclusion of the series, the American sculler in the men's and women's divisions with the most points will receive \$9,000 with second place earning \$3,500 and \$1,500 going to third. In the event a rower finishes in the first position for all three events, the foundation will award \$14,000. The prize money was increased through the generosity of our sponsors at HereNOW and Boathouse Apps. The race also pays respects to its late founder, Herb Lotman who lived the American Dream. A self-made man, Herb knew the importance of hard work

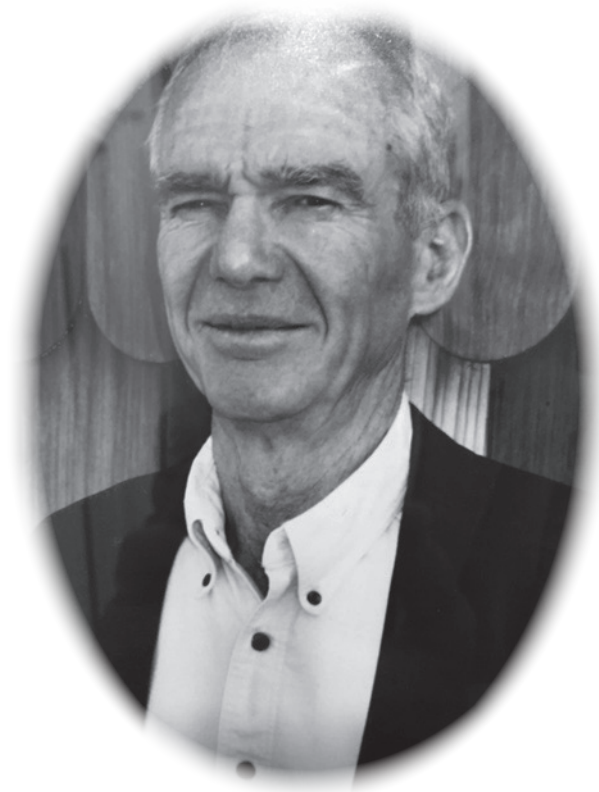


and motivation, but he was also a man of tremendous heart, who knew that wealth was irrelevant unless he used it to help others seize their American Dream.

In the United States, sculling at the national level is significantly underfunded and lacks the support of the National Training Center system; thus making the athletes, especially those in singles and doubles, bear the burden of subsidizing their training. This became increasingly clear as the Foundation hosted the last several years' of the Gold Cup, which led the Foundation to take a pause from the Gold Cup and focus on building a collaborative partnership. The hope is to draw attention to this lack of funding and find a way to inspire national and pre-elite scullers to participate in the inaugural Lotman Challenge. While the Foundation had a dream, our partners at USRowing, Head of The Charles, Head of the Schuylkill, and RegattaCentral and our sponsors HereNOW and Boathouse Apps turned it into a reality. The vision is to jump start financial support for American scullers and hopefully build momentum and funding for this event in the future.

The Philadelphia Gold Challenge Cup Foundation is a group of rowing enthusiasts who believe in the stars and stripes and try to live up to the high standards that Herb set. The Foundation is excited to support American scullers, cheer for them, and watch their American Dream be realized.

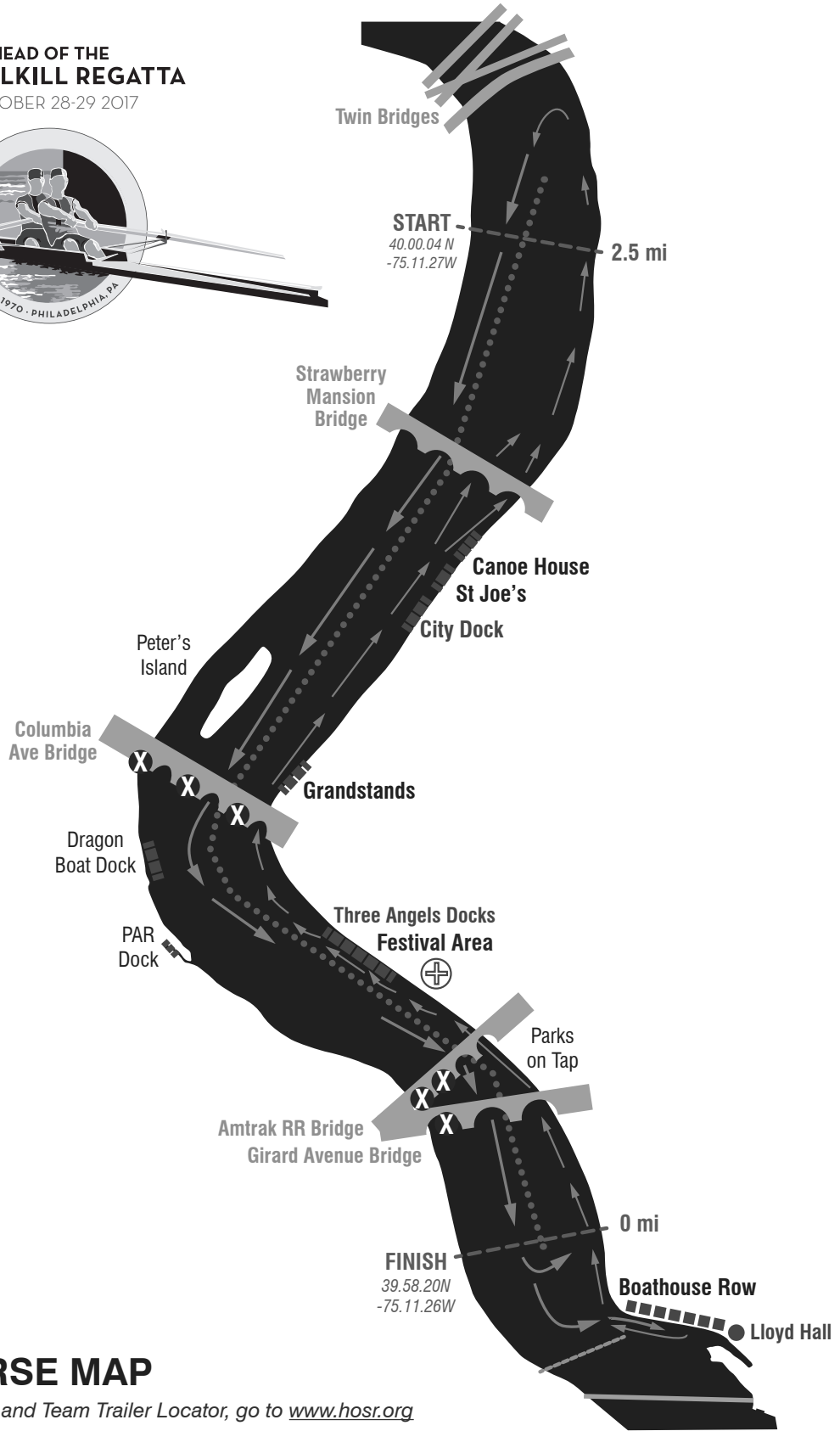

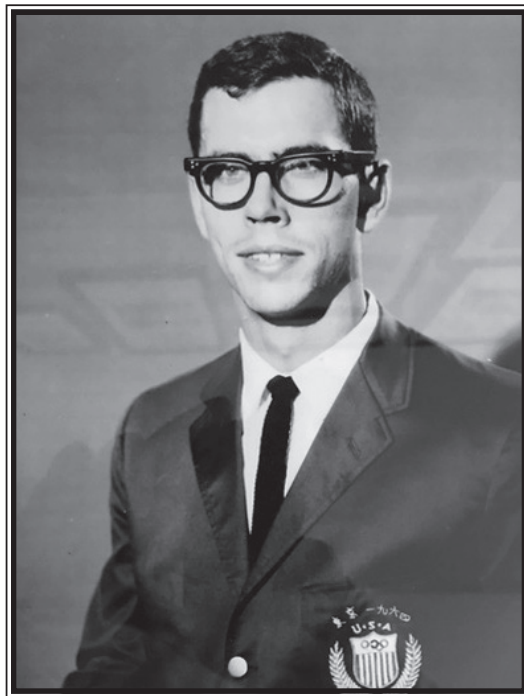

# Head Racing 101

## Frequently Asked Questions About Head Racing On The Schuylkill River

### What does a “Head” race mean?

**A** ROWING HEAD RACE is one in which competitors race the clock over a course typically 2 - 3 miles long – compared to side-by-side sprint races of 1,000 to 2,000 meters. Head races are a format that began in England; the term meant that the winner received the title of “Head of the River.”

### Where does the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta start and finish?

**T**HE RACE STARTS above the Strawberry Mansion Bridge near Hunting Park Avenue and finishes above the Viking statue above Boathouse Row.

### How long is the race course?

**T**HE HEAD OF THE SCHUYLKILL race course is 2.5 miles or 4,023 meters.

### Who rows in the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta? What are the events?

**I**N 2015, during the two-day regatta, there were more than 8,900 competitors in the Head of the Schuylkill in 1,913 boats.

Events include: Singles (one rower), Doubles (two rowers), Pair with and without Coxswain (coxswains direct and steer the boat but do not row), Quad (four rowers) and Fours with and without Coxswain, Rough water singles and Eights (eight rowers, each with one oar.) Racers compete in events, grouped by such categories as age, sex, high school, college, and more. For a schedule of events see the Program Book or the website at [www.hosr.org](http://www.hosr.org). The schedule shows the time of each race and the bow number of each boat entered in that race.

### What is the best way to follow a Head race?

**W**ATCHING A HEAD RACE is different from watching a sprint race because instead of all the boats starting at the same time and racing side by side, they start one at a time and chase each other down the course. Remember, in a head race, the winning boat is determined by the fastest time, not necessarily by the order in which it crosses the finish line. Incidentally, the Head of the Schuylkill adds a twist to the typical start line procedure.

You can follow a particular boat’s progress by noting its “bow number,” which is the large number positioned on the bow (front) of every boat. Basically, for each lower numbered boat it passes, a passing boat will have rowed the course faster by roughly 10 seconds.

Another important viewing tool is the “bow ball,” also located on the front of the boat. It mimics the boat’s momentum. Simply put, the bow ball should not bob or halt, but rather travel smoothly. Long and fluid strokes generally make for faster boats.

### What if a boat wants to pass another boat?

**I**F A COMPETITOR is in a passing position, the slower boat must move or “give way” to the side or risk penalty. This is an important aspect of the sportsmanship of rowing.

### How can I distinguish each team or rower?

**E**VERY BOAT in each race is given a number, known as a “bow number.” All bow numbers are listed in the Head of the Schuylkill program book. Many clubs also have identifying marks on their blades (oars) or uniforms – but they may be borrowed equipment from another club or team. Bow numbers are the most accurate method to distinguish competitors.

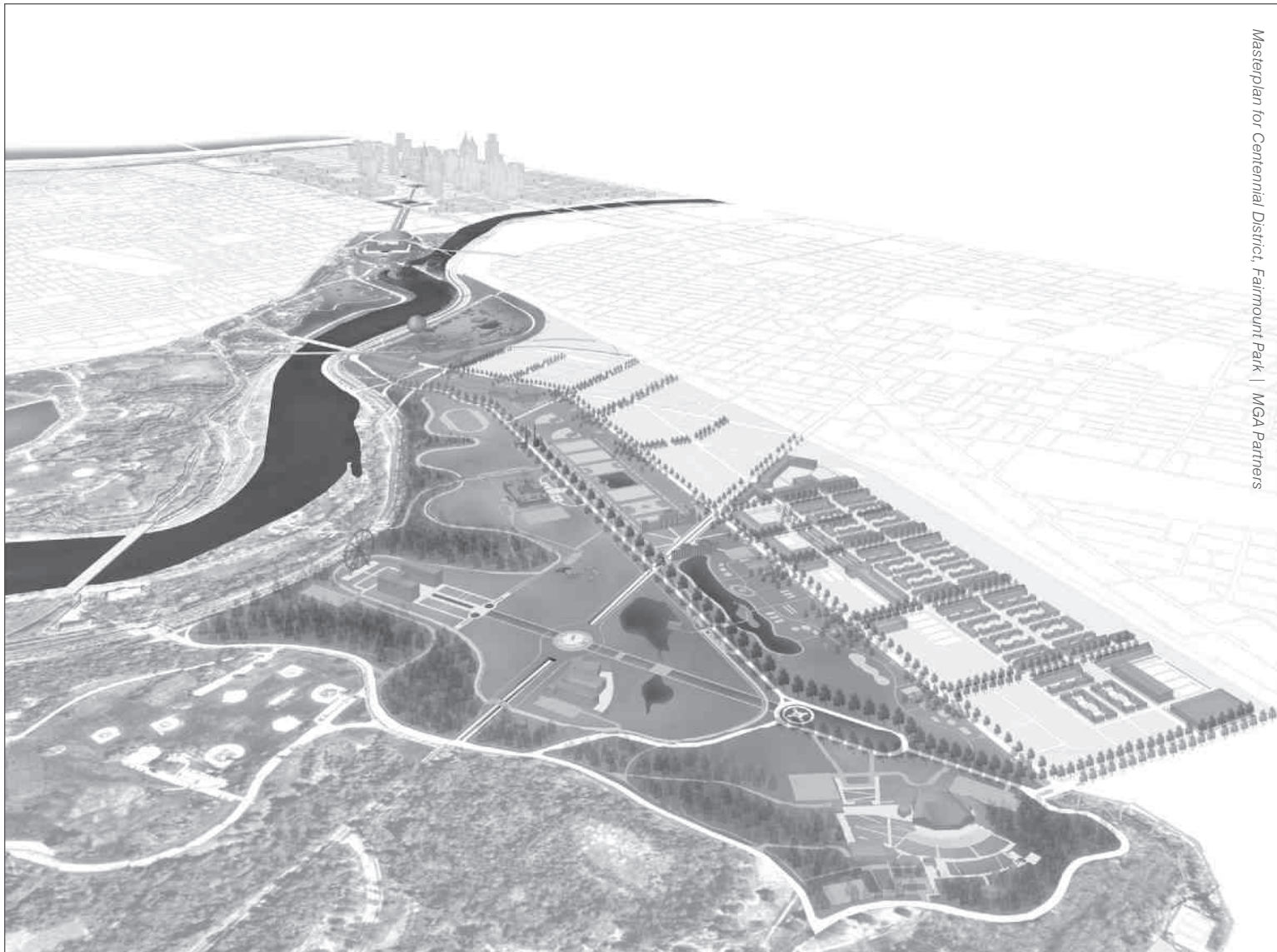
### How is each boat’s time determined?

**E**ACH BOAT starts sequentially, approximately ten seconds apart, and a start time is noted for each boat as it crosses the Start Line. The clock stops for each boat at the Finish Line. The exact time is recorded the instant each boat crosses the Start and Finish. The final Race Time is stated in minutes, seconds and hundredths of a second (for example: 18:35:33).

### How does a boat win a Head race?

**T**HE BOAT that rows the course clocked at the fastest time, after deductions for penalties, if any, wins its event. Deductions may be made for such infractions as interference with another boat, passing on the wrong side of a buoy, steering under the wrong arch of a bridge or unsportsmanlike conduct.

The preliminary times of all boats are posted generally within 15 minutes of the conclusion of each event. Race results can be found at the results station in the Festival Tent, at the Finish Line and online at [www.hosr.org](http://www.hosr.org).

## 5 Healthy Eating Tips for Athletes

### 1. Reduce Consumption of Refined Foods

Refined foods like packaged chips, baked goods, white bread and candy do not sustain the necessary energy levels that are required for athletic performance. Many processed foods, especially those with high-fructose corn syrup, stimulate spikes in blood-sugar levels, which can be detrimental to your energy levels and overall health. Refined foods also tend to contain processed oils such as hydrogenated vegetable oils, which can cause inflammation of the muscles and joints.

*Natural, unrefined foods that contain whole grain ingredients are the best choices for athletes, as they are rich in nutrients.*

### 2. Eat a Balanced Diet

Athletes should strive to follow a balanced diet at all times. While preparing for any athletic activity, especially competition, there is no room for compromise. Eating "junk food," or empty calories, can hinder performance and slow recovery.

*Consume a diet filled with whole, unprocessed foods: this will offer your body the complex carbohydrates, healthy fats, fiber, and high quality protein it needs.*

### 3. Eat Early & Often

Research shows that foods consumed early in the morning are more likely to be converted to heat energy rather than stored fats. Skipping breakfast tends to cause overeating in the evening, which can lead to the storage of fats, because the body will not immediately need the calories that are consumed.

*Eating frequently and in small quantities is ideal for an athlete's nutrition and will provide sustained energy throughout the day. Plus, since you are eating frequently, your body can tap into easily accessible energy whenever it is needed for training or competition.*

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## The Battle of the Weeds

**A** YEAR HAS GONE BY, and in my world as a masters rower, not much has changed. I'm still working full time, rowing in the morning, swimming in the evening, squeezing in some stretching and dog walking, and not sleeping enough. I play catch up every weekend, spend time with family, do chores, and get beat in the occasional regatta. It's all so dull and uninspiring, that I've been relegated to write about weeds.

The battle versus the invasive milfoil weed, began in earnest last summer. There are organisms on the planet that don't appear to have many redeeming qualities. Things like cockroaches, piranha, poison ivy, and milfoil. Centipedes eat roaches, goats will eat poison ivy, but apparently, nothing will eat milfoil. Rumor has it that if the weeds are piled up on land, dried out enough to die, they can be used for compost. But honestly, it's not like gardeners are fighting over milfoil compost. If all the milfoil were to evaporate suddenly, nothing would have it's food source cut off, water would flow without hindrance, and rowers, swimmers, and boaters alike, would rejoice. Last summer, Al Wachlin wrangled up as many willing volunteers as he could, to join him on his barge. They yanked the weeds by hand, piled them up, and got them out of the river, and off of the racing course.

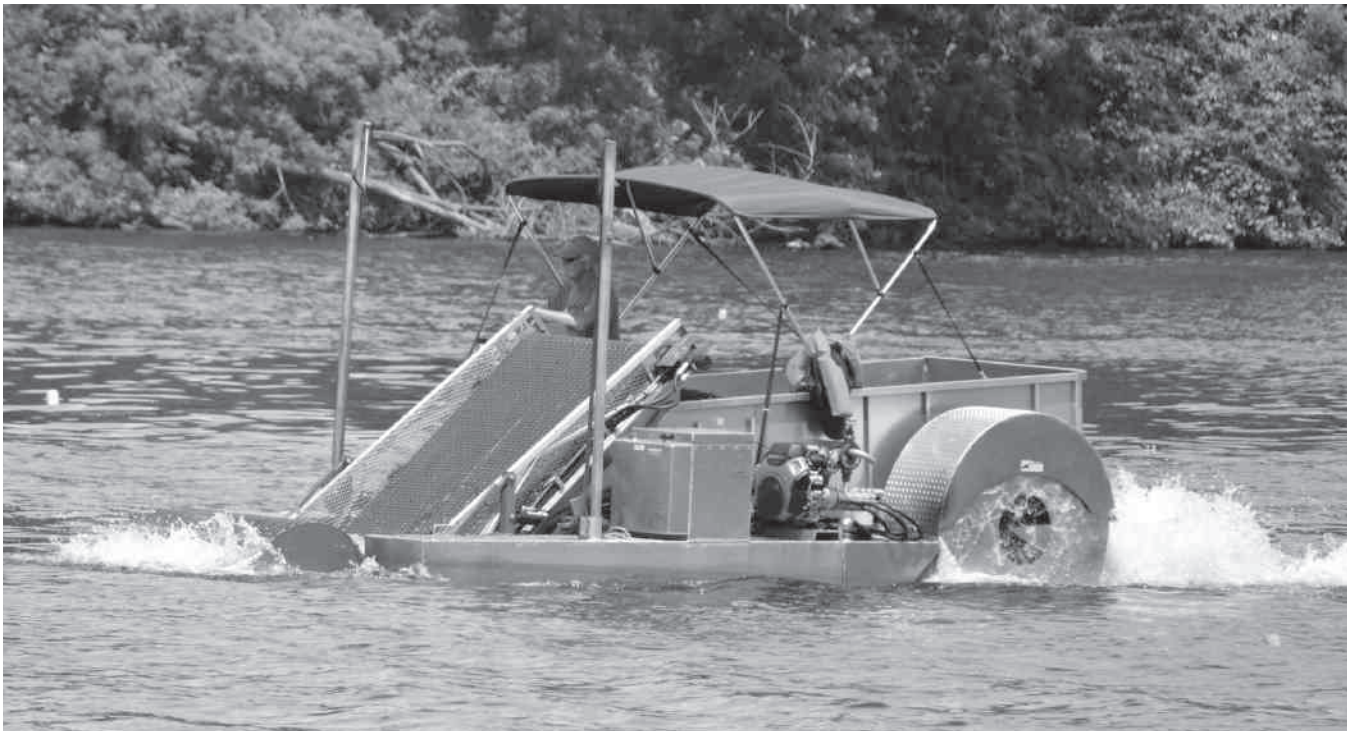
At the beginning of this summer, the devil weeds returned. After a lot of debate, hand wringing, and some slightly heated discussion, the Schuylkill Navy ordered the EcoHarvester from New Hope, Minnesota. The Eco Harvester is a heavy duty piece of equipment

that costs over \$70,000, requires some skill to operate, and more importantly, not break. Al Wachlin's loyal followers and fellow members of Fairmount Rowing Club, Bill Hudome, Craig Bischoff, and Joe McElevenny, volunteered to operate the machine, and possibly train others who were also mechanically inclined. Maintenance of the weed eater was donated by the Richard S. Burns Company (more ties to Fairmount). Everything was ready, except that the Eco Harvester was in Minnesota, and wouldn't be delivered in time for the first regatta of the summer. Who ya gonna call? Joe Sullivan, of course! Joe drove out to Minnesota, and then drove back with the Eco Harvester, just in time to clear the race course for the Schuylkill Navy Regatta.

In general, when single scullers see a motorized boat they cringe, some stop, some curse, and some go to great lengths to row when the river is empty. The first time I saw the Harvester, I clapped, cheered, and waved. Feel free to watch the YouTube videos starring the Eco Harvester; they are amazing. First you see a body of water that appears to be a field of lilies, next you see the Harvester transforming what seems to be a solid mass into a pond. If there was a sound track, you might hear cheering, and milfoil screaming in fear. Weeds be gone!

## Parents, Children and the Bond of Rowing

**T**IM AVENDT WILL NEVER FORGET the first time he raced in a pair with his father. It was 1984. He was just 14, and the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta had not yet created a parent-child contest. “We entered the men’s champion pair and came in dead last – and had a great time. We didn’t hit anybody.”

This year, Tim, now 47, will race at the HOSR with his 16-year-old daughter, Annie Avendt.

Such is the interest among parents and children that the HOSR now has four parent-child races: mother-daughter, mother-son, father-daughter, and father-son. Some parents have been competitive rowers for years; others are returning to a previous passion just to spend time with a child. Still others became rowers only after their children did. True of them all is how much they value the relationship over the victory.

### Tim & Annie Avendt

Tim Avendt forged a special tie with his father through rowing, something he sought to do with his daughter, Annie, as she became a teenager. “Rowing with my dad was special,” Tim said. “You’re out of your normal environment on the water. At times there’s peace and at times it’s very intense. We probably weren’t the best match.”

His father, a heavy weight, was a stellar athlete; he was lighter and less so. “We had to compensate for each other. Tim said. Still, they rowed well “because you have that bond. You know the person so well you can anticipate.”

Tim stopped rowing after college, but two years ago he learned about sculling classes at the Washington Rowing School and saw a chance to forge the same bond with his eighth grade daughter that he had had with his father. “I asked Annie if she was interested.”

They took classes an hour’s drive from their Clarksburg, MD home. Then Tim bought a double, which they car-top twice a week to a nearby reservoir.

“I made a conscious decision that this is just for enjoyment,” Tim said. He doesn’t strive for perfection, which can be fraught with stress. But as Annie’s technique has improved with sculling camp, they’ve started to gently coach each other.

“She may say, I’m off here and I may say you’re off there. Yelling, we haven’t done that.”

Father and daughter, in sync on the water, are also in sync about how they see their relationship. “We work in tandem,” said Annie. “If he’s doing something wrong, I’ll tell him. If I’m doing something wrong, he’ll tell me.

“I was never good at sports like basketball or soccer, but rowing, I felt I wasn’t bad at it. And I did it with Dad. We were always together. His passion was passed on to me.”

### Anne & Gabby Cutler

Anne Cutler and daughter Gabby Cutler, members of University Barge Club, are each racing independently in the HOSR. Both are serious competitors: Gabby, 26, crew coach at the Baldwin School, is training for the U.S. national team; Anne, 58, is her coach.

“Sometimes,” said Gabby, “it’s hard to tell the line between familial relationship and coach/athlete, which is also very close.” Helped by a sports psychologist, said Anne, “We’ve developed signals,” to let each other know if we’re crossing boundaries.

Anne got into competitive rowing in 1978 at George Washington University and has never stopped, even rowing while pregnant with Gabby. Still, she says, she did not foster her passion on her only child.



Whether it was genetics or the environment, Gabby fell for rowing. “My earliest memories are of being at UBC with my mother and the rowing community there. When I was 10 or 11, I said I want to row and she said, ‘Are you sure?’” After racing at Boston University, she turned to her mother for coaching.

Only as an adult, said Gabby, has she come to realize how similar they are – both stubborn, both competitive. “We had a joke that we can’t row over 1,000 meters without arguing. But then we’ll pass two boats and congratulate each other.”

This HOSR, said Gabby, “We might not race the double together, but it will be a mother-daughter day of racing.”

### Tony & Matt Valazza

For the Valazzas, from California, it was son Matt who inspired his father, Tony, to get into rowing. Neither had rowed before Matt arrived at Villanova University. “My freshman year, I couldn’t make Villanova basketball and I wanted to be part of a team, so I joined rowing, said Matt. His Dad flew in from California to watch the Dad Vail that spring and when Matt’s four won a silver, Tony told Matt, “I want to row with you!”

Tony, 56, bought an erg and for a year commuted 45 minutes from his home in Temple City to the Long Beach Rowing Association, then taught himself.

In 2013, when Matt was a junior, they raced the Head of the Charles.

“We finished horribly,” said Tony, “but it was one of the best times of my life to row with him. They lost their mother when he was eight ... Rowing is the thing that tied us together.”

In 2016, father-son tried the HOSR and loved it. Besides, it’s “a great chance to see my Villanova rowing buddies,” said Matt. They arrive this HOSR with little preparation. Matt, 26, has a finance

job in San Francisco, and mostly just ergs. The two live six hours apart and last rowed together in August.

“What’s hard,” said Tony, “is we jump in the boat in Philly against people who row together every day.” No matter. “It feels great,” said Matt. “I’m quasi-coaching him. It’s kind of a role reversal, but fun.” Said his dad, “It brings me together with him.”

### Charles & Molly Murray

When Charles Murray’s two daughters were about 10, the former World Rowing competitor would take them out in a double with him for fun. Crew stuck for a while with daughter Molly, who rowed at St. Joseph’s University. Then life intervened, and she left the river.

This summer, though, a family trip to Henley, England sparked Molly, 26, to begin training for the HOSR with her dad. The decision has already caught some wind. Molly, who works for the outfitter JL Rowing, was named crew coach at Philadelphia University.

Despite their rowing credentials, the two face challenges. Charles, 60, who still coaches crew, hasn’t competed in five years and Molly, 26, pretty much quit after college. But those racing against them should not breathe easily. They’re out practicing at 6:45 a.m. and report only two problems:

Quipped Charles, “I steer from the stroke seat and she stops for ducks all the time.”

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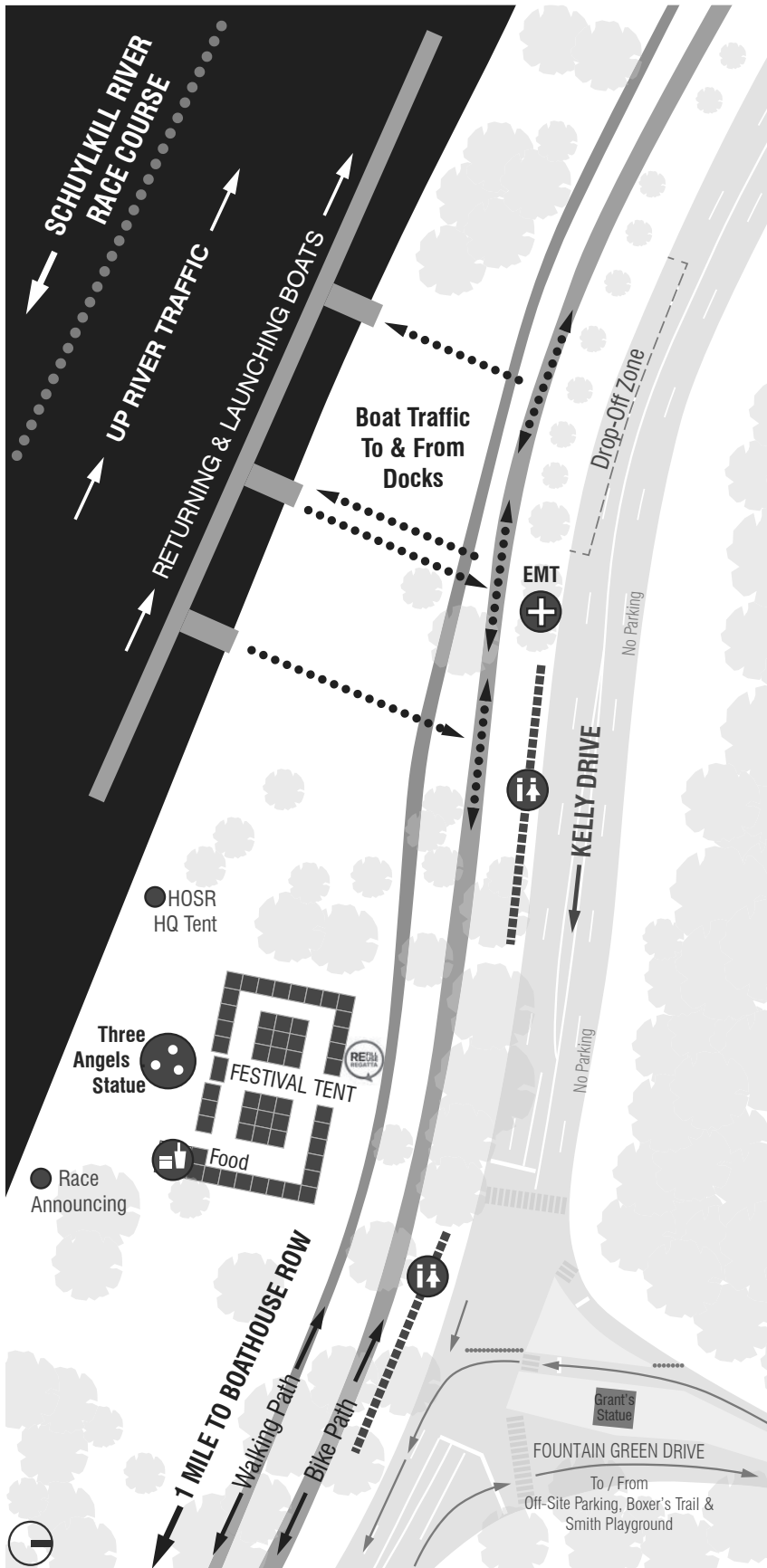

**T**HE BENJAMIN FRANKLIN PARKWAY is Philadelphia's great cultural axis and is known around the world for the world-class museums that make their home here. This tree-lined boulevard is also known as the Parkway Museums District, featuring sites such as the magnificent *Swann Memorial Fountain*, the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, and the famous "Rocky" steps that lead to the world-renowned Philadelphia Museum of Art. The Parkway was named after Founding Father Benjamin Franklin, and it spans a mile in length, revealing countless cultural treasures.

However, this year is especially significant, as it marks the 100th anniversary of Philadelphia's grand cultural boulevard. Dotty Brown, author of *Boathouse Row*, hosted a community conversation at Eakins Oval to discuss the history of Thomas Eakins, America's greatest realist painter and Philadelphia native, at the very spot on the Parkway named for him. The We Are Connected Festival set the tone for the rest of the celebration, showing off the significance of this opportunity to celebrate and cherish the wonderful cultural sites within the Parkway.

In your downtime, visiting the Parkway during its centennial year is a perfect opportunity to experience Philadelphia in a completely new way. Events range from special exhibitions at museums to exciting walking tours. In addition to museums, the Parkway Central Library of the Free Library of Philadelphia has two special Parkway history exhibitions on display. The Association for Public Art's self-guided audio tours, Museum Without Walls, helps guests explore the exceptional collection of sculptures along the Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Philadelphia native and rower, Eakins' art is as deeply entwined with the city of Philadelphia as the Parkway itself. Eakins was born in North Philadelphia, and he spent most of his life in the city. His collection remains in the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and features his famous painting *Oarsmen on the Schuylkill*.

If the name doesn't give it away, the landscape in the background makes it clear that the painting is definitely of the Schuylkill River.

## Great Partnerships Produce Results Taking the Water to Mander Recreation Center

**I**N 2016, THE HEAD OF THE SCHUYLKILL REGATTA (HOSR) announced a partnership with the Fairmount Park Conservancy, the Philadelphia Parks and Recreation Department and members of the Strawberry Mansion community to install a permanent water station at the Mander Recreation Center, located at 33rd and Diamond Streets. As an expansion of its important community outreach program, the HOSR is pleased to announce that the water station is now in operation and was dedicated on September 9th as part of the annual Strawberry Mansion Neighborhood Day and Boxers' Trail Run/Walk. The **REfill REuse** message was communicated to the hundreds of participants, young and old, along with the distribution of HOSR/Philadelphia Water reusable water bottles. The message was clear: together we can reduce the number of single-use water bottles and the inevitable litter and solid waste volume associated with them.

Rowing on the Schuylkill River in Philadelphia does not exist in a vacuum. Our rowing course is within Fairmount Park, neighborhoods, a city and a watershed stretching 100 miles upstream. Applying the principals of REfill REuse to our daily rows and regattas is important, but of itself will not result in a litter-free Schuylkill River. The same could be said about the Potomac, New York's East River and the other waterbodies on which many have the good fortune to row. But, by taking our message to and partnering with other communities and organizations, we can make an important contribution toward litter-free rivers.

The Head of the Schuylkill Regatta and the Schuylkill Navy are both members of the East Fairmount Park Coalition, 30 area groups working together to identify and contribute to the common goals of the East Park community and the city as a whole. Mander Recreation Center, serving the Strawberry Mansion neighborhood and beyond, is located in the East Park. There are both literal and figurative connections between the Mander Center and the River. The Randolph Creek Trail connects the playground to Kelly Drive (as well as to the magnificent Boxer's Trail). The Recreation Center is named after Joseph Mander who gave his life trying to rescue a drowning seven-year old child who had fallen into the Schuylkill River some 65 years ago.

Change to the better is not easy and does not happen on its own. But if a group of rowers working together on and off the river, partnering with a diverse group of people and organizations, can bring a much needed amenity to a recreation center, imagine the good that can be shared by all of us partnering within our communities and beyond to achieve litter-free rivers, parks and much more.

The HOSR is determined to continue to lead the way. According to Jen Wesson, Executive Director of the HOSR, "The Mander Recreation Center water station was a high priority outreach



effort, as it provides a resource to help the community further the litter free goals of the City. Partnerships were the key to making this happen, and they grow stronger with each success."

*Note: In Spring 2017, the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta began a partnership with Gideon Elementary, a pre-K through 8th community public school at 2817 West Glenwood Avenue, a half mile east of the Kelly Drive statue. Working together with the faculty, Mayor's Office of Education, the Philadelphia School District, the Fairmount Waterworks Interpretive Center and Philadelphia City Rowing (PCR), we celebrated the installation of the school's new water stations, spoke with the students about the importance in caring for our environment, the value of our parks and river, and opportunities to row (and of course each student received an HOSR/Philadelphia Water reusable water bottle). We look forward to building upon this partnership in the 2017-18 school year.*

# REfill REuse REcycle REGatta: REspecting the Park, River & Community

**T**HE HEAD OF THE SCHUYLKILL REGATTA (HOSR) and Schuylkill Navy River Stewards Committee's efforts to improve the quality of the Schuylkill River, East and West Fairmount Park and surrounding communities, continues to grow, especially with the help of a growing group of partners. Building off the HOSR's 2015 initiative to reduce the usage of single-use water bottles, we established three sustainability goals for the 2016 regatta – 1) eliminate single-use water bottles 2) reduce solid waste, and 3) approach becoming a litter-free regatta. Thanks to the combined efforts of our athletes, coaches, spectators, and volunteers – we made significant progress in meeting these goals and changing the culture of large events.

In 2017, Philadelphia joined New York, Los Angeles and other cities in establishing a breathtaking goal – to achieve a Zero Waste and Litter City by 2035. In concert with this goal, we ask ourselves - is it possible to achieve a Zero Waste and Litter *Regatta* with 30,000+ rowers and spectators over two days? Big goal. But we are rowers and families and friends of rowers. Is there another group of people more capable of working individually and collectively to achieve such a high goal than rowers? Not a chance.

To provide the infrastructure to help us reach Zero Waste and Litter and with the support of our partners, the HOSR is again providing fresh, clean Philadelphia water from the big, blue Water Monsters, and the Philadelphia Water Department is providing 15,000 reusable water bottles for competitors and spectators alike. We've created a dense network of trash and *recycling* barrels. And we are proud to introduce two new elements of our initiative: *Composting* - food waste receptacles will be positioned next to many of the trash/recycling barrel sets, collected and composted by Parks and Recreation and used as soil amendment to restore

parkland; and *collection of surplus food items* – HOSR will set-up three drop off points along the river, and our partner Food Connect will collect and provide the recovered excess food to emergency meal sites or pantries in the Philadelphia area. Are you up for the challenge? Below are **five actions** each of us as individuals and as teams can take to assist in meeting our goal of a Zero Waste and Litter Regatta:

## 1. Pack in, pack out.

**Minimize** waste left on site – Especially cardboard, Styrofoam and large food serving containers.

## 2. Leave single-use plastic bottles at home.

Utilize reusable water bottles and water stations provided by HOSR and bring large water jugs (one gallon or more), sports drinks in large containers and paper cups.

## 3. Place all waste not being packed out into the appropriate trash, recycling and compost barrels.

If a barrel is full, remove bag and replace from stock below or notify a regatta volunteer.

## 4. Apply our Zero Litter goal at all times and in all environments.

Check your area periodically and on preparing to depart. In addition, police **all** grounds for litter and place in appropriate barrel. Recruit teammates, family members and friends to do the same.

## 5. Donate surplus food.

The HOSR will set up designated areas for teams and individuals to drop-off food donations to be picked-up by Food Connect and transported to a local meal site, food pantry, food bank, or community shelter for consumption. ## Power-Rowing

**O**UR SPORT HAS ALWAYS BEEN ABOUT POWER. Whether it's the early-morning practices that encourage you and your teammates to go after every last bit of speed in a timed piece or the float on the recovery that generates its own speed—proving that power is sometimes best achieved by finesse—rowing demands power, and lots of it.

**I**T'S NO SURPRISE, then, to see the development of para-rowing. This year, para-rowing races were extended from 1,000-meters to 2,000-meter distances at regattas worldwide by FISA, bringing para-rowing into the spotlight it deserves.

There's no better way to see the power in para-rowing than to watch athletes from each of the three para-rowing classifications compete. However, if you want to do more than watch, now you can train and compete with a para-rower in a new event, the Inclusion Double.

Many clubs have opened their boathouse doors to athletes who row only with their arms and shoulders (the PR1 classification), athletes who row with their upper bodies, using their arms, shoulders and trunk to get a full swing, but no leg drive (the PR2 classification), and athletes who row with a full sliding seat and range of motion (the PR3 classification). Formerly called adaptive rowing, these programs have grown stronger by building a base of support for physically impaired rowers who simply want to get on the water, train and compete. It is in these clubs that rowers can join forces and train together, now that regattas are offering Inclusion Doubles, where one rower is classified as a para-rower and one athlete is not.

The United States has seen growth in para-rowing, and the national team been successful at elite levels, medaling in the Paralympics and World Championships. With the race distance now set at 2,000-meters, and a new boat category introduced (the PR3 2x), para-rowing is developing much like women's rowing and lightweight rowing did as they emerged onto the world stage.

Ellen Minzner, a two-time world champion in the women's lightweight pair (1995 and 1996), has been the national team coach of the PR3 Mixed 4+ since 2013. I rode along in her launch as her rowers finished their preparation for the 2017 World Championships, rowing out of the para-rowing training center at Community Rowing, Inc. (CRI) in Boston. It was here, on the early-morning water of the Charles River that is still and quiet, that I saw first-hand what she had described as the goal for para-rowing in the United States: the power of para-rowers propelling a boat with the speed that only comes from thousands of hours of training.

The four athletes Minzner was coaching that morning were the 2017 national team members who had spent the summer training, competing, seat-racing and earning a spot on the national team.

Dani Hansen, the stroke of the PR3 Mixed 4+, is a silver-medalist at the 2016 Paralympics and the 2014 and 2015 World Championships, and rowed as a Husky for the University of Washington. Three-seat is held by Zach Burns, a rower from the University of Michigan who was in the boat with Hansen for the past three years, winning a silver medal in the 2016 Paralympics and the 2014 and 2105 World Championships. Two-seat is the new-comer to the boat, Mike Varro, a sculler-turned-sweep-rower from Orlando, Florida. And Jaclyn Smith is again in the national team boat, rowing in the bow-seat, having won silver at the 2016 Rio Paralympics, and the 2014 and 2015 World Championships with Hansen and Burns; Smith rowed as an undergraduate at Sacred Heart University. Jenny Sichel is in the coxswain's cockpit again this year after coxing the boat to the three silver medals in 2014-2016.

As I watch the rowers move their boat through warm-up drills, steady state pieces and, finally, their race walk-through, I get lost in the practice, fussing with my camera and angling for the perfect shot. Minzner tells me, as the morning light grows brighter, that the biggest challenge the national team faces is recruiting. "We have to create the events at local regattas to get athletes to come out. You have to start there. You find the athletes and put them in races at a regatta that will help them grow. When you create the events, more and more people will come out. You start there and find a few rowers and put them on the pathway."

Minzner talks with the urgency of a good coach, wanting to deepen the pool of athletes who train at a level that will make the best boat go faster. "There are tons of kids rowing in college right now that are eligible to row as para-athletes who don't even know it," she says. "They don't know that their vision is limited enough to be classified as a para-rower, or that an injury they have would qualify them. Either they don't know it or they don't want their coach to know it. But, if you can make the national team and get international experience, you can come back to your college team with an edge. The opportunity to compete at this level is worth it. Get the edge to beat that guy [in a seat race] because you've been to the line in an international race before." She pauses here. "Experience at this level can't be found anywhere else."

One of the developments that is happening in para-rowing, aside from the race distance lengthening from 1,000-meters to 2,000-meters, is the movement among para-athletes and their coaches to row in the same size shell as other rowers. The PR1 Single and the PR2 Mixed Double shells have an international





minimum weight requirement that is 10 kilograms heavier than the shells used for the Single and the Double events for other rowers. Boat makers are advancing the technology available for para-rowers, adapting the equipment for safety and comfort. One example of this is Resolute Racing Shells, a boat builder in Bristol, Rhode Island. Using the pre-impregnated carbon fiber technology they use to make their signature racing shells, they've developed carbon fiber seats and seat backs that allow a fixed-seat rower (PR1 and PR2 are both fixed-seat classes) to have ample stability for safety, form-fitted seats, straps and pads for comfort, and the most range of motion for speed. Their seats are made to fit into any shell—made by Resolute or not—so para-rowers can adapt their equipment for the most powerful rowing experience. Kate Mouligne, the para-rower representative at Resolute, says, “We want a person who rows with adaptive equipment not to have to think twice about it.”

Resolute also sells a single shell with pontoons and a reinforced seat deck (the fixed seat puts more pressure on the seat deck than a sliding seat) for para-rowing that is lighter than the FISA minimum-weight standard for para-racing shells. “Why make the athlete work harder [in a heavier boat]?” Mouligne asks.

Minzner, the national team coach, feels the same way. “I’d really like to see our best athletes rowing in the best shells. Racing a

single with pontoons is just as stable as racing a wide, heavy boat.” She slows down here. “When you see the smiles on their faces when they can move a boat ten seconds faster per 500-meters...” As her words trail off, I know this is what every rower wants. “If we can reasonably and safely put a para-rower in the best equipment, recruiting will get easier.”

Para-rowing events are growing and becoming an expected offering at regattas. This is just the beginning, though, of a revolution that is happening in our sport. “Para-rowing is not just inspirational stories,” says Minzner. Sometimes, when talking about para-rowing, I’ve seen people get puzzled by the pronunciation of “para-rowing,” thinking they’ve heard “power-rowing.” Maybe they’re right. This revolution is just beginning.
